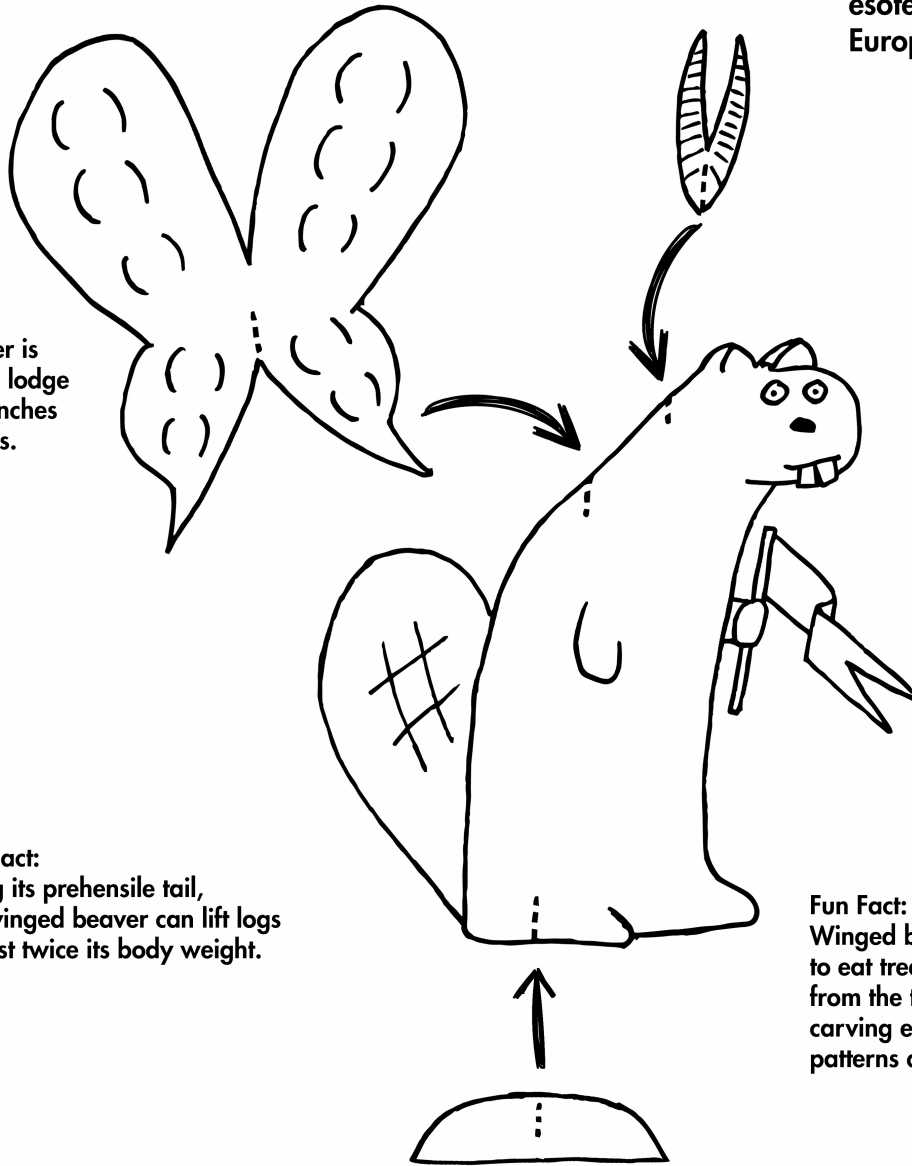


Friendly Little Creatures!

almost twice its body weight.

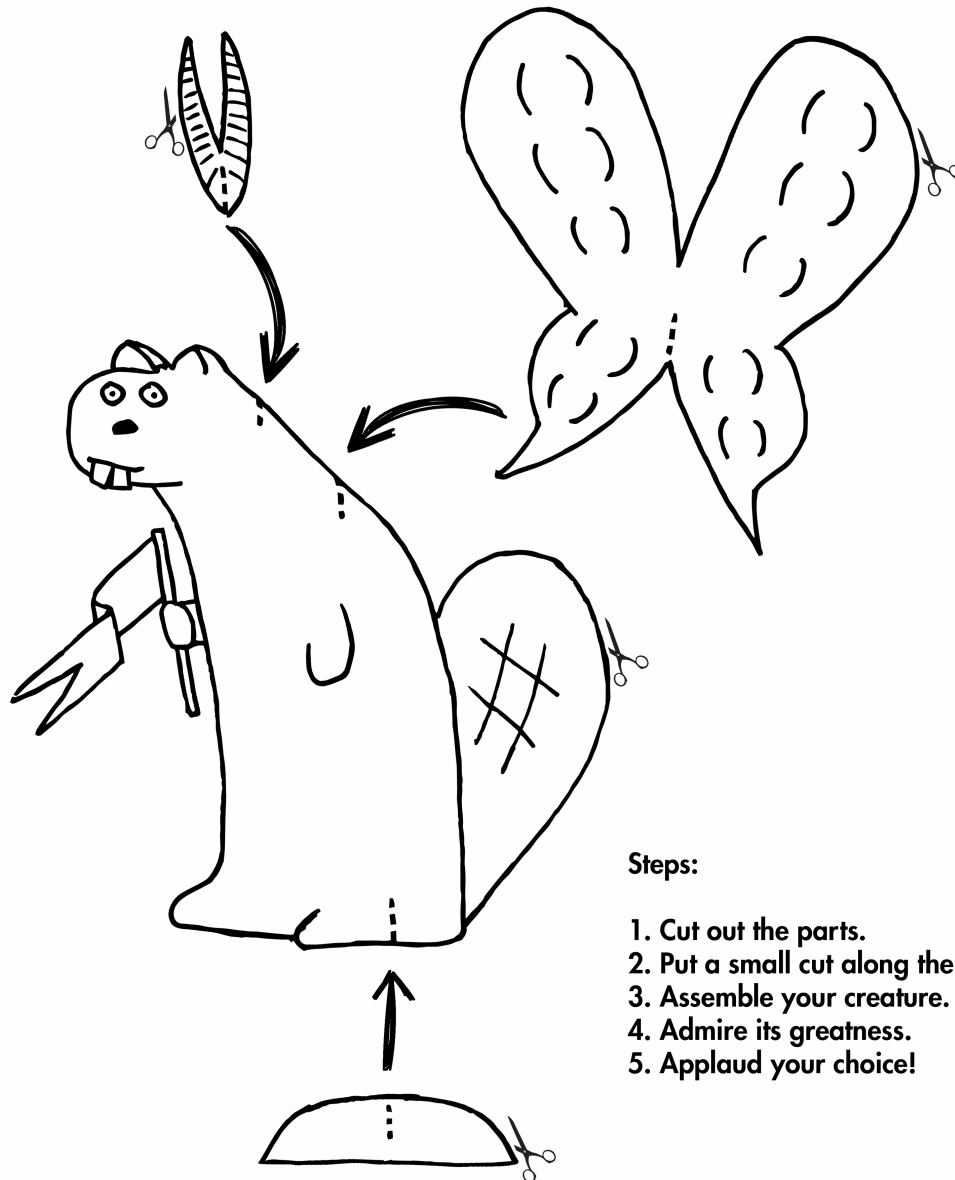
Fun Fact:
